The female constants of his paintings also express his connection to femininity, defying the traditions of "machismo" his heritage dictates. His work is in various collections across the United States and Europe. He is also the founder of Latin Pop Shop, Inc. and a contributor to the Arts section of The Huffington Post.

"I affectionately coined the series 'Latin Pop' after years of unsuccessful attempts at categorizing the work as one genre or another. The series combines elements of Pop, Cubism and Folk and is flavored with a Latin sensibility. I consider it my signature style as it has consistently continued to develop for well over a decade. No matter what other styles I might experiment with, I always come home to Latin Pop."

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# Biography

Born in Bayamón, Puerto Rico to a Puerto Rican father and mother of Italian descent from New York, John Gascot's early art influences came from the island's rich culture and heritage. The traditional papier-mâché *Vejigante* masks worn at island carnivals, the works of Puerto Rican artist Luis Germán Cajiga, and artwork and symbols of the indigenous Taíno people—among many other elements of the island—all had a hand in shaping John's artistic development. As John grew, so did the sphere of artistic influence; Pablo Picasso, Fernand Léger, Henri Matisse, Paul Gauguin, Frida Kahlo, Stuart Davis, Keith Haring, cubism, pop art and Aboriginal art are among his favorite artists and styles. His mother and other strong women in his life are his Muses.

At the age of 12, his mother brought him to the mainland and he soon began to explore working in the arts. While attending Sayreville War Memorial High School in Parlin, NJ, John studied Visual Arts, Creative Writing and Theatre, and served as Co-President of the Improv Troupe. John had supporting roles in productions of *South Pacific* and *Guys and Dolls*, and lead roles for *Finian's Rainbow*, *Plaza Suite*, and *Arsenic and Old Lace*. A writer as well, his poetry, fiction and short plays featured

frequently in both *Odyssey* and *Images*; literary journals sponsored by the Sayreville school district. For college, John attended Fordham University's Lincoln Center campus in New York, NY, majoring in Acting and Playwriting.

During his time in New York, John's paintings began to sell. Weekend booths in the Flea Market on Columbus Avenue and St. Mark's Place in the West Village attracted early buyers such as actress/writer, Tina Fey, ABC news anchor, Steve Bartelstein, and everybody's favorite supermodel, RuPaul Charles. At an outdoor market in the Hamptons, Chantal Bacon purchased one of his paintings as a gift for her business partner, fashion designer Betsy Johnson. Soon after, he was selected for his first solo exhibit at Rollebeek Gallery 28 in Brussels, Belgium.

When John and his partner, Ron, bought a home in Pennsylvania, he began taking art classes as a way to socialize and meet artists in the area. The couple later teamed up with decorative artist (and former *Folies Bergère* showgirl) Gwen Warnke and opened their own gallery in Milford. The Alliance for the Promotion of Artists (A.P.A.) Gallery represented artists working in a variety of mediums. A.P.A. established Milford's monthly art walk, *Art After Dark*, and held annual themed shows, such as *Seeing Women*; an exhibit of visual and literary arts celebrating Women's History Month.

A.P.A. closed when they moved to Levittown, PA, but John continued to paint, and galleries around the U.S. continued to request his work. John's work also reached an even greater audience thanks to the internet. After launching his personal website, www.gascot.com, John was able to connect directly with fans of his work in various countries.

In late 2009, John incorporated and founded Latin Pop Shop, Inc.—named after his signature style—an online art gallery and retail boutique promoting Latino artists and Latin-themed arts from around the world, including: the United States, Argentina, Colombia, Mexico, Guatemala and The Dominican Republic. In 2010, <a href="www.LatinPopShop.com">www.LatinPopShop.com</a> competed in its ecommerce host's \$35,000 Ecommerce Makeover Contest. BigCommerce selected LPS as a finalist; it later tied for second place.

Highlights of John's art career in recent years include:

- Juried into the Workhouse Arts Center in September 2011 as a Studio Artist
- Co-organizer of art exhibits doubling as community fundraisers (*Have A Heart Project*, *4 Equality: A Show of Pride* and *Duets*)
- Works selected for auction at the Human Rights Campaign's black-tie Annual National Dinner in Washington, D.C. each year since 2009

Of his own pieces, John says, "My work strives to honor and celebrate life, our differences and imperfections." As one half of the dynamic art duo known as *The Art Monkeys*, John creates unique mixed media works of art with Workhouse studio mate MG [Mary Gallagher] Stout. Of their collaborations, he notes, "Our canvases are the platform on which discussions take place. Sometimes they are introspective and sometimes they are playful. They are free visual expressions of ideas, unrestricted from subscribing to a specific style or genre." The energetic pair refers

to their collaborative work as "an ongoing conversation" about the purpose and necessity of art in 2012. Gascot & Stout's artistic mission is to make art accessible to all and explore its potential as a vehicle for social change.

John is currently living in Northern Virginia with his partner of 15 years, Ron Diana, Director of Education and Campus Operations at NMTI (National Massage Therapy Institute), and their two rescue dogs; Lola, an exuberant and adventurous Basset Hound, and a very handsome and loyal 150-lb Saint Bernard named Bogart.


